### RESPONSIVE READING SHAKING AND RATTLING PENTECOST

A Re-telling of the Pentecost Story (Acts 2: 1-13)

*The shakers are shaken when lines printed in bold are spoken  
(SW) shake shakers WILDLY (SR) - shake shakers in rhythm*

When the day of the harvest festival called Pentecost had arrived, those of us who were disciples of Jesus gathered together in one room. Suddenly, from the heavens, there came a sound like a wind rushing. It was a wild and furious wind.

**It rattled the windows and rattled the doors.** (SW)

The wind seemed to fill the entire house where we were gathered.

**It rattled the tables and rattled the chairs.** (SW)

The wind swirled around us and unnerved us.

**It rattled our arms and rattled our legs.** (SW)

**It rattled our knees and rattled our elbows.** (SW)

**It rattled our heads and rattled our hearts.** (SW)

With the wind came dancing flames of fire.

**They danced on our arms and danced on our shoulders.** (SR)

Then the flames seemed to rest above each of our heads.

**They danced on our heads and danced in our hearts.** (SR)

The wild wind ceased,

and the peace of the Holy Spirit settled upon us.

**The Spirit danced in our heads and danced in our hearts.** (SR)

Each of us began to proclaim the good news about Jesus Christ.

Each of us spoke the good news in a different language.

Each of us spoke in languages we had never spoken before –

**as the Spirit danced in our heads and danced in our hearts.** (SR)

Then we got up and left that house. We moved out into the streets to share the good news. People gathered to listen, and each one heard the good news in their own language.

By the power of the Spirit, we danced the good news for them.

**We danced with our voices and danced with our words.** (SR)

**We danced with our arms and danced with our legs.** (SR)

**We danced with our knees and danced with our elbows.** (SR)

**We danced with our heads and danced with our hearts.** (SR)

In the dancing and in the speaking, in the wind and in the flame, the good news about Jesus was proclaimed.

After that day of Pentecost,

we went out into the world to share the good news.

**And God's Spirit continues to dance in our heads and dance in our hearts, and dance in our arms and dance in our legs, and dance in our knees and dance in our elbows, and dance in our dreams and dance in our lives. Amen.**
