## NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

The report for the Sunday School for 1943 reported that 52 sessions of the school were held during the year. The membership of the school was 230 students with an additional 204 Cradle Roll members. The amount raised during the year was \$1,200 for the School, \$381 for Missionary and Maintenance Fund, and \$50 from the School's Thanksgiving session.
