What an unprecedented journey we have had over the past several months! Rev. Miriam Bowlby, who is currently on unpaid leave, has volunteered to do virtual worship services on-line and will be delivering our Easter Service virtually. More details will be forthcoming how we all can participate in this service. Rev. Miriam has also indicated that she will be resuming her ministerial work with Cochrane Street United Church on April 20<sup>th</sup>. This is earlier than she had planned, but Rev. Miriam felt compelled to return to provide pastoral care and guidance during this stressful time. We thank Rev. Miriam for her volunteering at this time of need and look forward to welcoming her back – A sign of the coming renewal.

As we celebrate this Easter, let us reflect on all the goodness and joy that life has given us and remember that we will all play our part in responding to this pandemic which will end in time. In our church, we have planted the seeds of hope, compassion and joy.
