## 2023 Easter Message from your Church Council

Easter Greetings to you and your family from Cochrane Street United Church Council.

We have also reintroduced the fellowship time after the worship service which provides a time of fellowship and catching up among family and friends of Cochrane Street while enjoying a cup of tea or coffee together.

The Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday April 23, 2023, immediately after the worship service. As this time of year is a time of renewal, so it is with the Church Council. A number of members who have served us all faithfully over the past number of years and have provided stability over our rocky journey are stepping down.
