Council and the congregation will be reviewing the report and once a congregational decision is reached about the direction of the congregation, it will be forwarded to Regional Council for their support and approval.

Our Outreach Ministries continue to make a mark in the community. We are participating and providing contributions and support to Cochrane Centre, Bridges To Hope and the General Protestant Cemetery Committee. We have hosted and helped plan an insightful presentation and discussion about the history and on-going impacts of residential schools on Labrador Inuit titled "OUR LONG JOURNEY: THE LEGACY OF RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS IN LABRADOR" as a meaningful response on the path towards reconciliation.

Presenters Andrea Procter and Ashley Dicker along with United Church representatives Charlotte Jewczyk of Cochrane Street, Rev. Rebecca Pike of Gower Street and Rev. James Ravenscroft of St. James have worked over the summer and early fall to create this learning opportunity.

Thank you to you all for undertaking these initiatives and to those other volunteers who have continued to sustain the life of our congregation during challenging times.

Yes, there is much to be thankful about at this time of year. We look forward to what the future has to offer as the Spirit continues to move us in new and bold directions.
