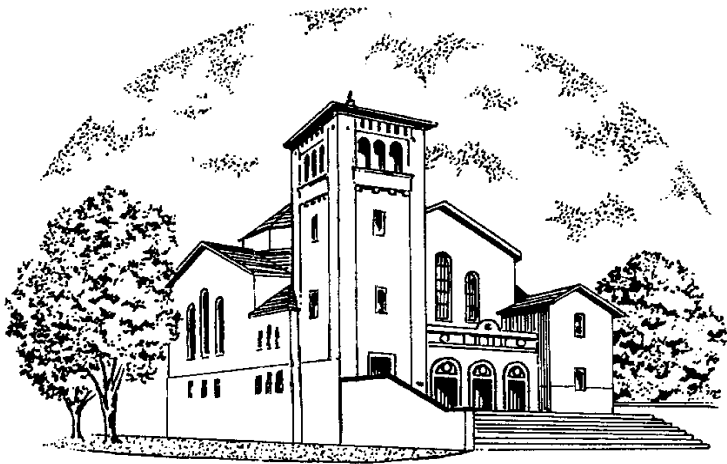

## NOTES FROM THE ARCHIVES

The basement of our first church building (1882-1914) had a Sabbath School room of 50 x 12 feet and an infants' room of 34 x 30 feet. The latter had raised seats and was separated from the other room by folding doors. With two other rooms in the basement, the basement space provided for a main Sunday School area along with a primary room, class room, and library, which, by 1887, contained 430 books.
